
After a full school day and then an hour of community service, the contestants were tired and eager to go home.



### Review of the novel

## 150tsi

"Tsotsi" is a novel written by author and playwright, Athol Fugard. It depicts the inspiring story of a gangster, Tsotsi, and his journey of redemption and the search for his identity.

It is the prescribed novel for Grade 11 English HL. It cogitates on universal and familiar concepts in a more vivid and refreshing sense.

It tackles the essential theme of redemption. It allows us to question if everyone deserves a chance at redemption and reformation. Today, people are quick to write off people who have done crimes with indifference, to reject the idea of giving them a second chance but this young man's story reaffirms that anyone can redeem themselves if they choose to change.

It brings some introspection into how we treat people who have done bad things. I think that judgement can also be deemed one of the other more implicit themes in the novel. Tsotsi's story is a particularly tempestuous one. When we investigate it and see his struggles, it forces us to question if crime is always a choice. It reiterates that we should not always judge someone on their cover, and we should pay more attention to how and why they became who they became.

A moving story of a young man that is filled with highly debatable themes at every turn. It is just a compelling book that I would recommend to anyone who loves a good storyteller.
