HAD THEIR FUN, IT WAS TIME FOR THE JUNIORS! THERE WERE +- 40 JUNIORS AND THE INTERACT MEMBERS HID

ANOTHER +- 250 EASTER EGGS FOR THEM TO HUNT.







































Milliam Neethling


