




The cancer kid

U.14 rugby

The u14 group has eagerly taken to rugby, in spite of the fact that only a handful of them have previously played the game. As coaches, our immediate task was to get the boys to fall in love with rugby and this was achieved within two sessions. Their first introduction to the game was through 6 down touch rugby, which greatly aided their skills and development. We have had an average of 26 players turn up to training, with a maximum of 34 at a single training session. This leads us to believe that there is definitely room for a B team. We also expect the numbers to increase going into season so that we can field two teams for fixtures. There are players of interest who have the potential to be fantastic going forward. Using the Connect approach, we believe that the sky's the limit for these boys, as well as any others, who wish to put in the work and sacrifice. Pre-season fixtures have given the players a taste of what's to come with fixtures against Parklands, HTS Bellville and Paul Roos. These have been valuable learning experiences in which the B team also got a fixture. The boys are looking good to have a season filled with learning, enjoyment and some wir long the way.

U.19 A rugby

Our first team played their initial game for the season against a touring team from Belgium, winning 12 - 10. It was a rocking start and got us going! Thereafter we played in the Kraaifontein Rugby Day, where the boys showed good skills and strength, beating Scottville 36 - 5. The West Coast Festival, which is an annual festival and the general start to the winter sport season, saw us taking on - and beating - Milnerton B (31 - 0) and Camps Bay High School (39 - 0). The boys put up a total of 70 points with 0 points against us, showing our great defense. We also took on Montana High School on short notice at the Brackenfell Sports Day, winning 26 - 0. We commend our boys for showing a lot of character and commitment. A week later we went to Paul Roos with a 5 game winning streak. The boys learnt a lot from the game against one the top rugby schools in the country, losing 26 - 3. It taught them how to be better and to work hard at our goals. However, the score does not reflect how well the boys played.

We look forward to having a season to remember.

U.15 rugby

Throughout the pre-season we've seen immense growth and development in this team. There is a strong culture in the group and their love for rugby grows with every training session. They've had a few tough pre-season fixtures but the boys showed courage and rose to the challenges. The combination of on-field training mixed with gym training means that the boys will be athletically developed, conditioned and mentally prepared for the challenges the season will bring.

U.16 rugby

The u16 boys have shown good growth throughout the pre-season, developing into a team that we think will deliver some good results this season. The boys have shown a lot of interest in getting better and learning more about the game during their training, and are eager to get the season started in the second term.

Netball

The pre-season has been fun, challenging and filled with growth and development for the netball girls. It is clear that they have the talent and passion for the game. They need no motivation or invitation and with continuous and focused coaching, they will be very good. Our focus will be on strength and conditioning work as well as fitness and agility. All age groups started very well at the pre-season netball tournament and in order to improve, our girls need to come to the gym to hone those existing skills.
