**RESOLUTIONS OF THE BUDGET MEETING
WITH PARENTS TO BE HELD ON 3 November 2022
AT BOSMANS DAM HIGH SCHOOL
19h00**

RESOLUTION TO BE PROPOSED:

1. SCHOOL FEES

I propose that:

- a) The school will be a fee-paying school and school fees have been determined and levied in accordance with the provisions of Section 38 and 39(1) of the South African Schools Act.
- b) The school fees are determined in terms of the above Act and are in relation or participation of the learner in any of the school programme as defined and approved by the parents.
- c) All other programmes or activities as defined and approved are not part of the school programme, are voluntary and carry an additional cost.
- d) School fees for 2023 determined and levied to be R23 330 for GR8 learners and R22 330 per learner for GR9 to GR12.
- e) School fees for GR9 to GR12 are payable in 11 equal instalments of R2 030 per month, commencing on the 1st January 2023 and ending the 1st November 2023.
- f) School fees for GR8 are payable in 12 instalments, one instalment of a R1 000 and,
11 equal instalments of R2 030 per month, commencing on the 1st January 2023 and ending the 1st November 2023.

2. SCHOOL FEE PAYMENT PLAN

I propose that:

- a) School fees payable in full by 31 December 2022, in which case a discount of R2 030 will be granted.
- b) School fees payable: R2 030 by 1 January 2023 and 1 February 2023 and the balance in full by 28 February 2023, in which case a discount of R1 200 will be granted.
- c) 2023 School Fees payable by monthly debit order from February 2023 to December 2023. On condition that 10 monthly debit orders of R2 030, were paid without fail, from February to November, a 50% discount of R1 015 will be granted on the final instalment in December 2023. Parents to sign debit order forms at the Finance Office.
- d) Should any monthly instalment be outstanding by the due date the full annual school fees will become due and payable as well as all costs incurred.
- e) A parent's school fee debt (full or to the extent that he has been exempted) is a statutory obligation and thus takes priority over other voluntary debts as listed under voluntary programmes.
- f) The school can record the non-performance on school fee obligation to a credit bureau and take legal action against such non-performance.
- g) The school has the right to verify all information supplied to them.

3. EXEMPTIONS

I propose that:

- a) All parents shall be obligated to pay school fees in terms of section 40 of the South African Schools act unless they have been granted exemption from the payment of school fees. The criteria for the total, partial or conditional exemption of parents, who are unable to pay compulsory school fees, be determined in accordance with the criteria set out in *The Exemption of Parents from School Fees Regulations* (as amended in Government Gazette 39392 of 17 November, 2006)
The determined amount is payable in equal monthly instalments.
- b) Debit order forms can be signed at the Finance Office to pay the determined amount in equal monthly instalments.
- c) Parents of foster learners are granted full exemption of school fees only. Parents are obliged to hand in legal documents as proof of foster care.


