## PROCEDURES FOR DETENTION

## THE DETENTION SESSION:

- 1. Detention will be from 14:30 16:30.
- 2. The earliest learners may be excused will be at 16:30 and only if the behaviour of the group was exemplary.
- 3. Learners will be allowed to do their homework, read etc.
- 4. Teachers may allow learners to use the facilities; however, only 1 learner may leave the room at any given time. Teachers are encouraged to use 5 minute increments when determining when the next learner may go. This reduces the tendency for everyone to insist on going.
- 5. There must be order and silence at all times.
- 6. Learners who misbehave will be given a warning (individually or in a group) and if this does not help an extra DT can be given.
- 7. If the misbehaviour continues the offending learner will be excused and the case referred to the tribunal.
- 8. The names of the offending learners as well as action taken must be given to the teachers in charge of detention.

## MISBEHAVIOUR DURING DETENTION:

- 1. If the learner continuously disrupts detention the invigilating teacher may place the child on another detention.
- 2. If this does not help the child will be excused from detention and the case referred to the tribunal.

## ABSENTEEISM FROM DETENTION:

- 1. It is the learner's responsibility to supply the teacher responsible for DT with a note from the parents/guardian explaining the learner's absence as soon as the learner returns to school after an absence.
- 2. If no note is forthcoming the learner will be given an extra detention.
- 3. If the absenteeism continues the parents will be contacted.
- 4. If these measures are not successful the case will be referred to the tribunal.
